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4 Writing Sample

All candidates, regardless of GPA, must successfully complete the writing sample, demonstrating adequate graduate level writing skills.

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5 Two Completed Reference Evaluation Forms

These references must be from persons who are familiar with the applicant's professional or academic abilities. If the applicant is currently teaching, at least one recommendation should be from an administrator or supervisor who is familiar with the applicant's work as a teacher.

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6 Test Scores (those seeking their Initial Licensure)

Submit a Praxis II score in their intended endorsement area before beginning coursework. Praxis score can be waived if student has a major with 3.0 GPA in subject area for some 6-12 secondary areas. Students can be admitted as a degree-only student without Praxis score. (must sign waiver of intent to seek licensure).

Register at ets.org/praxis to take the appropriate Praxis II content knowledge test for your endorsement. Scores should be sent to Union (code 1826) and the TN Dept. of Education (code 8190)

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7 Background Check

Applicants seeking initial licensure must complete the **Background Check**.

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3 Official Transcripts (Page 5)

Official sealed transcripts from all universities attended are required. Please see page 5 for more information.

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4 Teaching License

For those with a TN Teacher License – this can be downloaded from the State of TN **website**. You may upload your teaching license with the application

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5 Writing Sample

All candidates, regardless of GPA, must successfully complete the writing sample, demonstrating adequate graduate level writing skills.

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6 Graduate Education Recommendations

1 recommendation from your Principal/Supervisor, 1 recommendation from professional colleague, 1 recommendation from the director of your school system (Instructional Leadership Specialization Only)

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7 Verification of Experience Form (Instructional Leadership Only)

Must be **completed** by applicant's school system documenting at least 2 years of teaching experience.

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8 Performance Evaluation (Instructional Leadership Only)

Please upload a copy of the most recent performance appraisal [must be within the last 3 years]. The evaluation must be signed and dated by your evaluator.

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9 Resume

Please upload an up-to-date, carefully prepared, and error-free resume.

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10 Faculty Interview

This will take place after all steps have been submitted.

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How to Apply for Financial Aid:

- 1 Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).** The FAFSA is **available online**. If you do not have access to a computer you may request a paper version from the Financial Aid Office. **Students should submit the 2026-2027 form. You will need your 2024 Federal Tax Return, your FSA ID, and Union University's code (003528). Graduate students are considered independent for financial aid purposes.**
- 2 Review your Student Aid Report (SAR) for accuracy.** Online processing time for the FAFSA takes 2-3 business days. The Department of Education will notify you when your application is processed and will provide you with a Student Aid Report (SAR). If you notice any errors after reviewing your SAR, log back into your FAFSA to make corrections.
- 3 You will receive your financial aid award letter from Union once you have been academically accepted.** This lists the financial aid you will qualify for. If you wish to decline all or a portion of the award, notify the Financial Aid Office in writing. Be sure to contact the Financial Aid Office if you have any questions on your award.
- 4 Complete Loan Entrance Counseling and the Master Promissory Note Entrance.** Counseling is only required for first time Federal Direct Loan borrowers; all borrowers must complete a Master Promissory Note. Both can be completed at <https://studentloans.gov/myDirectLoan/index.action> (you will need your FSA ID from Step 1).

Federal Loan Requirements:

To be eligible to borrow funds under the Federal Direct Loan Program, you must:

1. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
2. Be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident
3. Not be in default on prior educational loans
4. Maintain satisfactory academic progress

Enrolling in a Pay-As-You-Go Payment Plan:

The Nelnet Business Solutions (formerly FACTS) payment plan gives families and option of budgeting monthly payment. Please apply for a payment plan online at uu.edu/paymybill or with the Student Accounts office at **731-661-5071**.

The Federal (Title One) Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program:

If you and your school qualify, this program may provide loan forgiveness for eligible Federal Direct Loans. This is a separate program requiring separate forms and processes. The U.S. Department of Education will determine your eligibility for this program. Union University is not responsible to verify your eligibility for this program. Please do not base your enrollment on this program, as it can be difficult to ensure qualification for government programs which are subject to reform and funding changes. **You must call 1-800-4-FED-AID to verify your eligibility or visit <https://studentaid.gov/sa/repay-loans/forgiveness-cancellation/teacher> for more information.**

The TEACH Grant:

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program, created by Congress through the College Cost Reduction and Access Act of 2007, provides grants to students (Undergraduates or Graduate) who intend to teach in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves students from low-income families and teaching in a high need field. If a student fails to complete the teaching requirement, the grant will convert into an Unsubsidized Direct Stafford Loan. Recipients of the TEACH Grant MUST complete the **TEACH Grant Application**. Additionally, if offered a TEACH Grant, TEACH Grant Counseling and an Agreement to Serve (ATS) must be completed each year the award is received — both can be completed below.

Union University requires official transcript(s) showing all course work, completion of baccalaureate degree(s), and all graduate credit previously attempted. Even if withdrawal occurred prior to earning credits and even if those credits do not apply to the current degree being sought, official transcripts must be sent from each institution. **Must be a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale combined.**

REQUEST OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS:

There are multiple ways to request transcripts, and each college or university will have their own process. Typically, the easiest way to order official transcripts is:

- 1 Contact the Registrar's office at your previously attended school, either by phone, email, or through your university's website.
- 2 Submit a transcript request following that school's procedures. Most colleges and universities require a signature or other official request in writing. Many schools have a Transcript Request Form available to download on the Registrar's website. Some will allow you to order transcripts online.

Note: Some colleges and universities charge a small fee for official transcripts. Be sure to enclose your fee with your transcript request to avoid a delay in processing.

- 3 It can often take several days for a transcript request to be processed. When your transcripts are received, the Graduate Information Office will contact you, but if you have not received confirmation within 14 days, please contact us at **(731) 201-0980**.

SEND ELECTRONICALLY:

It is the policy of Union University to only accept electronic transcripts from the institution or from an established provider such as Script Safe, Parchment, National Student Clearinghouse, Docufile. We will not accept copies emailed from the student(s) in any format. Once Admissions has received the transcript(s), the transcript(s) will be printed and stamped as official for Union University.
